

In-depth, hands-on workshop on **Oct 5.**

Slow Meets Social Media: Digital Storytelling, Listening, and Learning Via Out of Eden, led by **Carrie James** and

Liz Dawes Duraisingh, Project Zero at Harvard
Graduate School of Education, and Pulitzer
Prize-winning journalist and National Geographic
Fellow **Paul Salopek**.

Drawing from Salopek's Out of Eden Walk and Project Zero's Out of Eden Learn initiative, participants will experience the activities and platform designed to promote digital storytelling, listening, and learning. Emphasis will be on the value of integrating slow, low-tech and/or offline creative activities with opportunities to connect and share with others via social media. Participants will engage with Salopek's journalism, try out activities from the Out of Eden Learn initiative, engage with fellow participants and develop ideas for incorporating the leaders' broad principles or specific activities into their own practice.

Carrie James

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Carrie James is a research director and principal investigator at Project Zero at the Harvard Graduate School of Education. Her research explores young people's digital, moral, and civic lives. With Howard Gardner, Carrie co-directs the Good Play Project, a research and educational initiative focused youth, ethics, and the new digital media, and the Good Participation project, a study of how youth "do civics" in the digital age. Carrie is also co-PI of Out of Eden Learn. She is a faculty member for the Project Zero Classroom and the Future of Learning summer institutes. Her publications include *Disconnected: Youth, New Media*, and *the Ethics Gap*. She holds a Ph.D in sociology from NYU.



Liz Dawes Duraisingh

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Liz Dawes Duraisingh is a research associate and principal investigator at the Harvard Graduate School of Education's Project Zero where she co-directs Out of Eden Learn. This work builds in part on her doctoral research, which explored the ways in which young people use the past to help make sense of their own lives, identities, and values. Liz also directs Creating Communities of Innovation, a new project that supports inquiry-driven professional development across a network of different school settings. She teaches Introduction to Qualitative Research at the HGSE and was previously a middle and high school history teacher.



Paul Salopek

Out of Eden Walk
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Born in California, Paul Salopek crossed his first border at age six when his family moved to central Mexico, where he later worked as a rancher and cowhand. For years he made his living as a commercial fisherman. As a foreign correspondent, he has reported on conflicts in Africa, the Middle East, Central Asia, and Latin America, as well as on global topics such as oil production, overfishing, and the human genome. His stories have appeared in *National Geographic*, the *Chicago Tribune*, *The Atlantic*, *Foreign Policy*, *The American Scholar*, *The Best American Travel Writing* and other publications.
